Azores University is a public institution of higher education dependent on the Portuguese Ministry for Science, Technology and Higher Education. Established in 1976 with the aim of fostering the sustained development of the archipelago of the Azores, it currently has about 5.800 students, 430 teachers and 205 other staff members. It is divided among three campuses: *Ponta Delgada Campus* (Island of *S. Miguel*), *Angra do Heroísmo Campus* (Island of *Terceira*) and *Horta Campus* (Island of *Faial*). It is a structure of departments and schools, mainly geared towards teaching and research.

Since the labour market is extremely mutable and continuously demands new education profiles, the University is not only committed to create new undergraduate degrees, but also offers a very significant number of Master's Degrees both in the field of human sciences and in the field of exact sciences.

## Academic Calendar

The academic year is divided in two semesters. The exact dates of their beginning and end vary from year to year. Here is an approximate idea of the usual calendar:

<b>First Semester</b>
From mid-September to mid-February (including exams)
Christmas Holidays: two weeks

<b>Second Semester</b>
From mid-February to the end of July (including exams)
Carnival Holidays: 2 days
Easter Holidays: one week

## Mandatory documents to enter and stay in Portugal

### Entering and leaving Portuguese territory

To enter or leave Portuguese territory, foreigners must be holders of a valid travelling document recognized by Portuguese authorities, such as a passport. Nationals from EU countries may enter Portugal presenting only their identification card.

Travellers that enter or leave Portugal from or to a country that has not signed the Schengen Convention will be controlled at the border. Holders of a student visa arriving from a Schengen country must declare their entrance to the authorities, within 3 days, if they have not been controlled at the border (if their passport has not been stamped). This declaration may be made to *SEF – Serviços de Estrangeiros e Fronteiras* (agency in charge of border control and foreigners) in Ponta Delgada, Angra do Heroísmo or Horta.

### European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)

From 1 March 2005, the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) has replaced the E111 and E128 forms. It is mandatory for all Erasmus students to be holders of this card. Students arriving from a country not covered by this card must have a health insurance.

The EHIC is a personal and individual document, issued free of charge and generally valid for 1 year. It guarantees access to medical treatment and drugs in accordance to EU Regulation and only in state-operated facilities. It may be used in the 27 EU countries, as well as in Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.

## Student Visa

Students from a non-EU country or from a third country must obtain a student visa to: (i) follow a study programme on an officially recognized educational institution, (ii) carry out scientific research either to obtain an academic degree or of scientific interest acknowledged by an officially recognized educational institution, (iii) undergo a job training program to complement studies, (iv) undergo a job training program in a company, public services or training centre.

The visa application is presented abroad, in a diplomatic or consular mission (a Portuguese embassy or consulate), in the country where the student lives. The visa permits multiple entries in Portuguese territory, and it can be valid for up to a year (renewable).

The applicant must provide a document that demonstrates his/her ability to support himself/herself in Portugal or that he/she has been granted a scholarship. If relatives accompany the student, they should apply for a temporary stay visa.



## Resident card

Students from EU countries and other countries that have signed the Schengen Convention, as well as their relatives, may apply for a resident card if they wish. The application must be submitted within 90 days after entering Portuguese territory. To do so, students must prove that they have enrolled in an officially recognized educational institution, and that they have a health insurance, which covers all the risk, or that they are covered, in Portuguese territory, by a social security system. The applicant must also to guarantee to SEF that he/she has resources that will not place him/her in need of public funds (for instance, prove that he/she has been granted a scholarship).

## Azores — history and culture

Discovered in 1427, the Azores soon attracted people from the most diverse places, who established themselves here. This influx has allowed a sustained demographic growth ever since the time of early settlement (about 17.000 inhabitants in the late 16<sup>th</sup> century) up to the present (241.763 inhabitants divided by 19 municipalities and 5 cities).



The geostrategic location of the islands made them a singular place for migrations. First, as an area of immigration, they attracted people from the Portuguese Mainland, Madeira, Europe, Africa and even from the Far East, and later, as an area of emigration, as people left for Brazil, Canada, the United States, Bermudas, among others.

From this crossing of influences and civilizations arose a very rich culture, which is visible not only in the underwater heritage, part of which is still hidden in the depths of the Azorean sea, but also in the terrestrial heritage, materialized in fine buildings, such as churches, palaces, rural houses and gardens. The constant worries about earthquakes, which have always accompanied lives of the islanders, had a decisive impact on the way Azorean cultural activities developed; these include the Festivities of the Divine Holy Spirit, the Procession of Lord Holy Christ of Miracles and the bullfights.



## Climate

The climate of the Archipelago of the Azores is essentially dictated by the geographical location of the islands within the context of the global atmospheric and oceanic circulation and by the influence of the aquatic mass from which they emerge.



In very broad terms, the climate may be characterized by mild temperatures (sea level temperatures: annual average of 17°C, February average of 14.5°C and August average of 22°C), by high humidity levels (above 80%), by relatively low sunlight levels (1600 full sunlight hours per year), by regular and abundant rain (sea level precipitation: from 750 mm on the Island of Santa Maria to 1700 mm on the Island of Flores) and by a vigorous wind regime, which goes around the archipelago, following the evolution of atmospheric circulation patterns at the North Atlantic basin scale.



The temperature of seawater, higher than the one in European coastal regions at the same latitude, varies regularly throughout the year, oscillating, in average, between 15°C and 23°C.

## How to get to the Azores

There are regular daily flights from Lisbon to the Islands of S. Miguel (John Paul II Airport) and Terceira (Lajes Airport). Daily flights between Lisbon and the Island of Faial take place during the summer but only 5 times a week during the winter. There are also daily flights between Oporto and S. Miguel during the summer and 3 times a week during the winter. Each trip takes about two hours. During certain times of the year, there are also charter flights from some European cities. These flights are carried out by TAP Air Portugal and SATA International.



There are daily flights between all the islands. The islands of the Central Group are also covered by daily maritime transport carried out by *AtlânticoLine*.

The flights between the islands are carried out by SATA Air Açores. During the summer, a company operates sea trips between all the islands. Passangers who are between 16 and 30 years old will get a discount if they subscribe to the youth card (*Cartão Inter Jovem*).
