

We would like to inform you that Erasmus on-line registration period for the academic year 2011/12 is available from April 15.

Step 1: Students should apply on-line and print the application form.

Step 2: send the following documents by ordinary mail:

- Application form of the University of Murcia (printed copy)
- 2 passport size photographs
- Passport or ID card photocopy
- Letter of the home university stating the Erasmus condition of the student

Deadlines:

1st semester and annual: from April 15 to June 30, 2011.

2nd semester: from October 15 to November 30, 2011.

We will not accept applications after this deadline.
