Work, and Self Study **USEFUL INFORMATION** From Monday through Friday / from 9 to 12 am and from 2 to 5 pm Please inform in advance about schedule arrival in Beauvais in order to get the room key **Arrivals** Possibility to pick up the student at Beauvais' train station or Beauvais's airport by the French buddy student Public transportation is also available (bus, train, taxi) Priority for all international students who want to live on the campus The accommodation form must be filled and signed, enclosed to the application form, in order to book a room early July for study period during Fall semester, and early November for study period during Spring semester 2 kind of rooms available: Accommodation *single room with private bathroom (€460 per month) *studio with 2 single rooms and shared bathroom (€230 per month) French financial subsidiary (APL) to ask upon arrival. In order to get ECTS credits / US credits you must complete them successfully Validation of exams with a minimum result of 10/20 or a grade between A to E. NB: 1/3 extra-time + French language dictionary to realize exams 2 levels: *students from countries where French is spoken *students from countries where French is not spoken Students registered for the degree "titre d'ingénieur" Learn French as a foreign language 2 hours of French as a foreign language - 2 weeks a month = compulsory / 2 ECTS credits. Students registered for a non-degree academic mobility
