	Students are recommended to submit their full application as soon as possible
Non-EU (Visa National) Students	 Non EU (visa national) students participating on the ERASMUS programme will require an entry visa in order to study in the UK. Students nominated for 6 months or less can enter the UK on a Student Visitor Visa. Please refer your students to the <u>UK Border Agency website</u> for further information. Students nominated for more than 6 month i.e. a full academic year, will be required to apply for a Tier 4 visa. Students applying for a Tier 4 visa must prove they meet the minimum English language proficiency entry requirements as stipulated by the UK Border Agency at the time of application - currently an IELTS 5.5 (or equivalent) for an official language test carried out within two years of the time of application. This level of attainment needs to be for all four components of language learning i.e. reading, writing, speaking and listening. This proof of English language proficiency should be submitted at
	the same time as the application. Students who do not meet the minimum language requirements for all four components will not be offered a place to study abroad at the University of Reading.
	CAS numbers (required from Reading in order to gain a Tier 4 visa) cannot be supplied to students more than 3 months before the commencement of their studies at Reading. Please refer your students to the UK Border Agency website for further information.
