To obtain the UPEM student card, upon arrival, incoming students must present the following documents:
 Proof of enrolment at their home university the year of mobility. Without this, incoming students must pay the enrolment fees (180€) Copy of the European student health card (European students). Non-European students must pay for the French health insurance (200€). Payment of a compulsory medical exam (approx.5€). Payments by cash or credit card.

French courses	French language courses are offered to incoming students, free of charge, throughout the academic year. These courses are split into three levels, three hours per week, with a placement test in October.			

Preparing for the student mobility			
Accommodation	UPEM has an agreement with the CROUS to provide student accommodation.		
	The application form is included with the other forms mentioned above. We recommend that all interested students send the form duly completed, as soon as possible as places are on a first come, first served basis.		
	 Fees: 300 € - 400 €/month, depending on the room and the residence Deposit: 233€ Rent paid in advance: 3/6 months, depending on the period of mobility 		
	Insurance: Students have to subscribe to a house insurance ($40 \in 80 \in 80$). Included in this insurance is the civil responsibility insurance, necessary to receive the UPEM student card.		
	Aid for rent: Students may apply for a housing aid to help pay their rent, from the government, called CAF. The application form and all information necessary are available upon arrival.		
University French Autumn Course (UFAC)	Every academic year, at the beginning of September, the UPEM organizes two weeks of intensive French courses and cultural outings.		
	 Fee of 150€ includes: French courses Cultural outings included in the schedule Lunch during the week (Saturday and Sunday excluded) 		
Visa & residence permit	Students from outside EU countries must apply for a visa. A letter of admission from our service is requested.		
	If the stay is longer than 3 months, a residence permit is needed. To apply for it: OFII (Office Français de l'Immigration et d'Intégration)
