Language requirements	Courses at the University of Zurich are mainly held in German. However, courses in English are offered in several fields of study. We recommend a minimum level of B2, as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), in the language of instruction.
	It is primarily in the responsibility of the partner universities to nominate students that have the according language skills. However, it is possible that we reject students if we perceive that they don't have the necessary knowledge to successfully follow courses and exams.
	Students who intend to take courses in German or English Literature and Linguistics, and who are non-native speakers of the respective language, are expected to have a standard of proficiency at the level of C1 of the CEFR in the respective language. In philology courses the language of instruction is often the language of the region studied.

Language courses	Students can participate in an intensive German course that takes place two weeks before the beginning of the semester. Other courses are offered during the semester.
